

FORM OUGHT TO GROW OUT OF FUNCTION. The United Methodist Church is trying to put this fact into practice. We design our organizational structures to become the means by which we fulfill our mission.

FOR EXAMPLE: If our mission as the Church is to be the Body of Christ in the world, to make the Gospel real in the lives of people, then certain structures of organization would help us to perform this task. WE WOULD NEED TO MAKE SOME PROVISIONS FOR STUDY. We would need to become familiar with what God has been doing in the world and especially what He has been up to in Jesus Christ — all of which has been described in the Scriptures. Further we would need background in understanding the sort of world we live in and what are the implications of the Scriptures for living in this world. We would need to understand all we can about ourselves as persons and what are the gifts of God to us and what demands He makes upon us in the area of personal morality and in the area of our relationships with each other in the Church and our relationships with others beyond the fellowship of the Church. ALL OF THIS PLACES UPON THE CHURCH A HEAVY RESPONSIBILITY FOR EDUCATION. So, we have a Commission on Education with Ken Howell as Chairman to help plan, develop, and direct the broad educational activities of our Church. This includes the Sunday School which in itself is an extensive structure for providing experiences of Christian learning for children, youth, and adults. But also there are numerous other educational opportunities which come under the responsibility of the Commission on Education. Training of teachers and leaders, Christian enrichment courses, Bible study groups, membership training, youth activities — in other words anything that can come under the classification of education and training are a part of this Commission's task.
