REKNOWNED ITALIAN ORGANIST TO PLAY AT TRINITY

GIUSEPPE ZANABONI, director of the Music Conservatory in Piacenza, Italy, will play an organ recital on Trinity's sanctuary organ on TUESDAY, APRIL 10, at 8:15 P.M. The program will consist entirely of organ music by Italian composers from the 17th to the 20th centuries. All members of Trinity are urged to attend this FREE concert and to bring your friends and neighbors.

Mr. William MacGowan, who played The Dedication Concert for our organ, and who is now Organist-Choirmaster at the Church-of-Bethesda-by-the-Sea in Palm Beach, writes of Mr. Zanaboni: "He was my host in Piacenza two years ago—is a fabulous organist, and plays the Italian literature . . . with such sparkle and zest. I was amazed at what a large body of music they have for the organ."

This concert is Trinity's Springtime gift to the whole community. It is made possible through the GENEROSITY OF TRINITY MEMBERS WHO HAVE MADE SPECIAL DONATIONS. 



THE MAASTRICHT EASTER PLAY — *Edited by W. W. Hollman*

Explanation: the Easter message, as found in the first verses of Mark 16, is dramatized in this 12th century musical drama which was performed regularly in Maastricht, Holland, from 1200 to 1500. Following over 400 years of neglect, the play was rediscovered in 1947, and had its first American production at Cedar Crest College in 1960. The music is that which was familiar to church congregations of the 13th century, plain-song, such as that found in Hymn No. 467 of The Methodist Hymnal. In addition to the story as found in Mark, three early hymns are sung: Alle, psallite cum luya, Alleluya; Victimae Paschali laudi; and Te Deum. The original text was in Latin, but will be sung in English translation in this performance.

Processional

Scene I: Mary Magdalene, Mary Jacobi, and Mary Salome come to the tomb to anoint the body of their Lord.

Scene II: The three Marys lament the death of their Saviour, but in coming to the tomb, find the stone has been rolled away.

Scene III: Angels at the head and foot of the Sepulchre tell the Marys that Jesus of Nazareth is not in the tomb, but has risen. They are urged to return to Galilee, if they wish to see Him.

Scene IV: Jesus makes himself known to Mary Magdalene, who has remained at the tomb.

Scene V: Two disciples come to the place of the tomb, but are told by Mary Magdalene that Christ has arisen and gone to Galilee.

Scene VI: After two Pilgrims have met a stranger on the road, their hearts are made to burn within them.

Scene VII: All are advised by the Angels to report the wonder which they have seen and experienced.
