Anne Morrow Lindberg says, "we all wish to be loved alone." ("Don't sit under the apple tree with anyone else but me.")

"All the lonely people. Where do they all come from?"

What's the answer to our need to be loved by one as individuals? What's the answer to loneliness? Can we solve it all by PROXIMITY — throwing people into physical closeness? If so then a special week-after-Christmas sale at Woolco's is the place to assuage your pangs of loneliness. But of course the loneliest place in the world might be a people-packed city street.

What we need is fellowship. So the Church says, "we'll provide fellowship. We'll stick a note on the top of the Sunday bulletin that says, 'we are the friendly Church!' And then we'll provide a time in the worship service for fellowship." So at 11:22 the preacher says, "O.K. folks, we're going to have fellowship now. I want you to look at your neighbor and smile, and shake his hand." So everybody slips on his smile mask, shakes hands with his neighbor, and all the lonely people think, "what's wrong here; I'm just as lonely as ever right while I'm having fellowship." But of course that's not what fellowship is. You don't turn fellowship on with the air conditioning — nor with the smile mask that the preacher persuades you to snap on for "fellowship time".

The family was eating and talking. Suddenly the little boy stood up on his chair and shouted, "PLEASE PASS THE BUTTER!"

"You go to your room!"

"But Dad —"

"No buts about it — you go to your room!"

But mother has pulled a fast one here. She has been recording on tape the dinner conversation. She plays the tape back. You hear the adult conversation and chatter. And in the midst of it all you can hear a little voice saying, "Please pass the butter!" Moments later you hear a little voice saying, "Dad, please pass the butter!" Then moments later you hear the final: "PLEASE PASS THE BUTTER!"

One lonely little voice cries in the wilderness but no one has the ears to hear.

Jesus said, "The first commandment is to love God." Out of that sort of relationship with God comes a remarkable capacity to love your neighbor. And that's where real fellowship is born. That's the real answer to loneliness. When we begin to be a gathering of people who begin to love God we will become more than just another congregation — we'll become a fellowship.

What can we know for sure? Some people would answer, "Nothing!" Some would say, "I know that I can know nothing!" But if a person can know nothing, how can he know that he knows that? "I know that I can know nothing" is a self-contradiction.

Others in dealing with the question, "What can we know for sure?" would reply, "The only things we can know that make any sense are things which can be substantiated by some sense experience." But, oddly enough, that very statement, "All we can know is what can be verified by some sense experience" cannot be verified by sense experience.

WE CAN KNOW THINGS FOR CERTAIN. We don't know anything absolutely. For after all, we know only our experiences of the world around us. We don't know the world; we know only our experiences of the world. This is true for all of us. Einstein talking about the task of the scientist said, "The object of all science is to co-ordinate our experiences and to bring them into a logical system." Notice he said that the object of science is to co-ordinate our **EXPERIENCES**. Another scientist named Niels Bohr said, "The task of science is both to extend the range of our experience and reduce it to order." What do we extend the range of, and reduce to order? Our **EXPERIENCE**.

We have to take it on faith that we are experiencing a real world that is "out there," and that the experiences we are having and our interpretations of those experiences are in harmony with what is "out there." The scientist (and the rest of us, too) **ASSUMES** that there is a world "out there."

When I say, "I see the tree!" I mean that certain light stimuli have excited the nerve endings in my eyes and electrical impulses have travelled along my nerves to the cells in my brain where they have been interpreted (with the help of previously remembered experiences) as "There is a tree." So, I say, "I see the tree."

All of us have "seen" things that were not there. I have "seen" mirages. Hypnotized people have "seen" snakes that were not present in the room. People under the influence of drugs "see" things that are not "there" at all. Our knowledge is knowledge of experience. And, as I have illustrated above, our experiences are far from being infallible. So, while we assume the reality of the world "out there" we cannot prove it. No reality can be proved to the satisfaction of a skeptic.

Also we have to take it on faith that there is order in the universe so that what we have observed in the past will continue to be reliable data for the future.

This is only a part of the facts which add up to the undeniable fact that **ALL OF US LIVE BY FAITH**. That is, we all live in a world where nothing can be proven absolutely—**SO WE HAVE TO ACT UPON THE BASIS OF EVIDENCE**.

This is quite a deep and involved subject for the front page of a bulletin. I know that. But I wanted to say something in answer to some folks I heard say recently, "But you see, you can't prove God or Jesus Christ!"

That's right! I can't! I live in a world where nothing can be proven. **BUT I HAVE ALL THE EVIDENCE I NEED TO BELIEVE IN GOD AND IN JESUS CHRIST.**
