BEING PRACTICAL ABOUT WILLS

Some people may consider the will an instrument of the rich. Since their possessions are small to moderate, they do not bother. Yet, if you consider the value of some of the small things you own, the total sum may be larger than you think. When you make your will, you write a testament to the people around you that you cared for them even at death. You say to them in a tangible way . . . "I care, and have evidenced it by providing for you."

You make your will because you love those near and dear to you. You don't want to leave their future in the hands of the probate judge, who must, to remain true to his calling, carry out to the letter the demands of the law.

These demands can mean limited funds for your wife and children — unnecessary taxes, costs of posting bond, perhaps long delays in settling the estate. More than one widow did not have full access to family property because the court had to look after the interests of the minor children, holding in reserve a large percent of the estate until the children were of age. These funds were desperately needed at the time and in the ensuing years to care for her children, to provide for health and educational needs.

Usually, husbands never intended their widows to experience such entanglements and red tape. It was just "one small thing" they never got around to.

What a difference it would have made if these husbands had only realized the state-made will (the laws applying to the settlement of estates where there is no will) would not fulfill their wishes. These laws have to be of such a broad general nature that they cannot meet specific situations.

There is another job a state-made will cannot perform — that is, making a gift in your name to Christian work, no matter what your giving patterns while you lived.

Many Christians want to make their final gift to God through their wills. How tragic it is when good intentions are unfulfilled. Every week thousands of dollars pass through the courts from the estates of people who have died without wills, who had intended for part of their funds to go to worthy charitable services. They never found the few hours needed to prepare a will.

Having an attorney draw up the will is the wisest plan and is not an expensive process in most cases. There are several ways to make a bequest to your church. You can name a specific amount. You can name a percentage of the estate. (Many Christians like to consider tithing their estates, as a final gift to God.) You can leave the residue.

Some people are not able to name a worthy cause for a part of the estate because of their responsibility to dependents. However, they are willing to include a charitable cause as the second or final beneficiary. (It is not uncommon for a will to be probated in which all the named beneficiaries have died.)

There are many Methodist related institutions worthy of at least a tithe of your will, Trinity United Methodist Church in particular. Some others are the Florida United Methodist Children's Home, Florida Southern College, and Bethune-Cookman College.

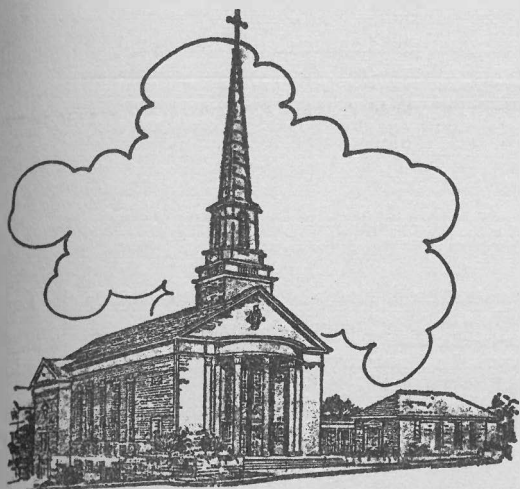

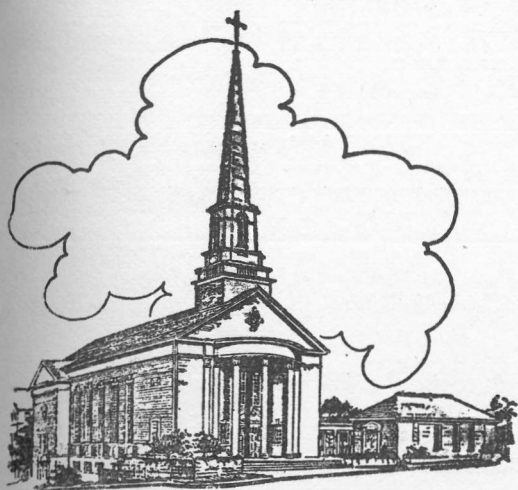

CHEAP CHURCH?

What kind of church would it be where the forgiveness of God was preached with no repentance required?

What kind of church could offer baptism without disciplines of preparation or follow-up whatsoever?

Who would flock to a Christian Church which advertised communion without confession?

How far could preachers go today pronouncing release from sin without requiring personal confession?

What kind of grace and love of God has no corresponding responsibility in the life of the one who accepts it?

Is it to be "taken for granted" that the Christian today lives only among "friends?"

Sadly, doing the church "thing" today is as different as night and day when we compare the "doing of one's own thing." A lot of people in the church today are doing just that, though: "their own thing." What happened to God in last year's budget? In this year's program? Are we "doing our own thing" and recklessly running in with a phrase "in the name of Christ" tacked on at the end or in the middle some place?

Cheap churchmen shudder at being required to really think through the "God bit," and yet that is precisely what we're called to do—be reasonable and realistic and responsible about what we were created to be and to do in response to God who loves.

Stand up and be counted! Write a letter to your preacher after you have thought through who you are and whose you are. Tell him what kind of church you'd like to see and why. Be honest. Changes *can* be made where necessary, believe it or not! Be responsible by citing specific ways you see yourself helping in the needed change. Your preacher *may* just take you seriously. The budget *may* be altered to reflect your suggestions. Think hard; Pray hard, then, make your observations.

Who knows, doing God's thing and doing your thing may become one in the name! Then, I'll bet—no "cheap" church here!

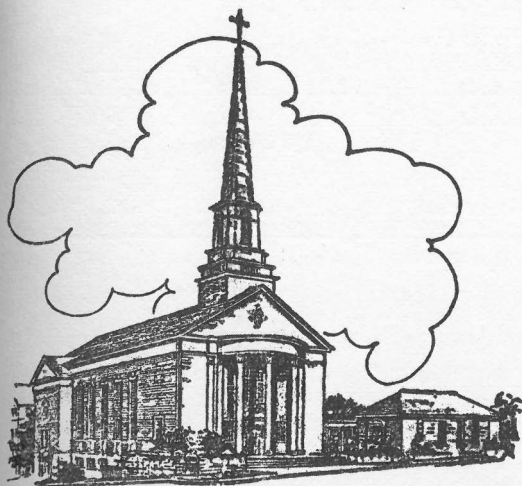
