PREACHING

I have decided to interrupt the series of messages I have been bringing on the Resurrection theme. This Sunday I will bring a message appropriate for Mother's Day.

But next Sunday I plan to preach a sermon dealing with Christian implications about LIFE AFTER DEATH.

Following that, I am planning to preach a series of at least four sermons dealing with OUR BELIEF IN THE HOLY SPIRIT.

EVENING WORSHIP

Even if you missed last Sunday evening's introduction to Christian Ethics you will want to get in on the next two sessions by Dr. Charles Wellborn, Professor of Religion at Florida State University.

By arranging this series of three special Sunday evening services, Harold Brown has provided all of us with an opportunity to get some much-needed background in a vital area of Christian understanding.

FINANCE

I realize it appears as though we are building a surplus of funds. Some people would say that when we are "over" that, we should not let people know about it because it might serve to invite some people to cut back on their giving. First, I feel that to be fair with you I should let you know when we are "over" just as readily as I let you know when we are "under" our budget. Second, I realize we are moving into the summer period when giving tends to decrease and that if this tendency persists, we will "eat up" some of that "over." Third, I know that in reality we never will have too much money in the face of the multiplicity of needs we face as a church. But I do want you to know that I appreciate very much the generous way in which you have been making it a pleasure to be a member of the Finance Committee of this church.

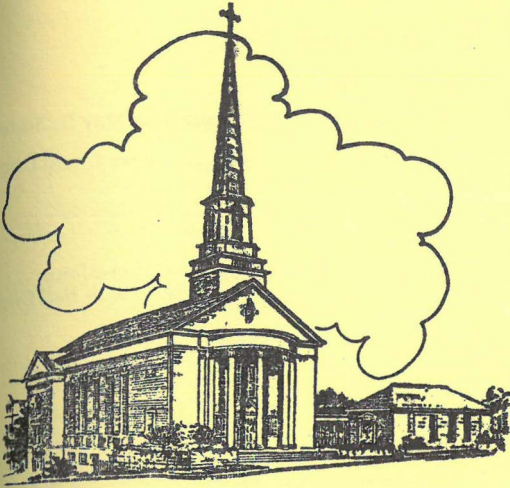

I DO NOT HAVE A GEOGRAPHY OF HEAVEN. I don't know anyone who has. I have run into a few people who were pretty dogmatic about the furnishings of heaven and hell. (I notice that the folks who are most vivid in their descriptions of the hereafter usually are describing a heaven for themselves and a hell for somebody else. "I know there is a heaven—my aspirations tell me so! I know there's a hell—that's where all my neighbors go.") I have made an interesting observation about people who talk about heaven—they tell me more about themselves than they do about heaven when they give their descriptions of heaven.

I heard someone say recently, "I've got a lot of questions about life after death. We all know we must die; but no one wants to talk about it."

One of the first things I have to admit is that I don't know all the answers. For that matter, I don't even know all the questions.

SOME OF THE QUESTIONS I INTEND TO FACE ARE:

1. Why believe in a hereafter?
2. What is eternal life?
3. Is heaven "pie in the sky when you die"? It is a reward for being "good"?
4. Is there something more than just immortality of influence?
5. Where do we get this idea of immortality of a little bit of us called the "soul"?
6. What about "I believe in the resurrection of the body"?
7. What does Paul mean by a "spiritual body"?
8. Will I know my loved ones "over there"?

Alan Walker in his book, "Breakthrough," says, "THE GREATEST SINGLE NEED TODAY is to discover again the fact and the power of the HOLY SPIRIT. Millions of people are being crushed by the pressures of life because they possess no power of the living God within. The Church is impotent, unable to rise to its role in modern history, because it has little knowledge of, or faith in, the Holy Spirit. The world is restless, tantalized by the vision of what might be, but cannot find the power to turn dreams into reality."

CONTINUING A SERIES OF SERMONS ON CHRISTIAN BELIEFS, I will begin today preaching through Pentecost and the month of June on the theme of the Holy Spirit.

Many questions have been raised in the minds of church members concerning the meaning of the doctrine of the Holy Spirit. I intend to deal with such questions as:

What do we mean by the Holy Spirit?

Is the Holy Spirit just an "extra" added to the Christian Faith?

Has not belief in the Holy Spirit been the occasion for a lot of excesses in the Church . . . excesses in emotionalism; and led the Church out on some strange tangents (such as speaking in "other tongues")?

What does the Holy Spirit do?

How can I know the Holy Spirit in my own personal life?

Is Pentecost a repeatable experience?

Do we believe in three Gods (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) or One God?

There are obviously more questions here than can be dealt with in one sermon. So I am developing at least five sermons to deal with the areas of Christian belief and life referred to in these questions.

In the Apostles' Creed we declare, "I believe in the Holy Spirit." I want to do what I can to help all of us to make such a declaration more than just a vague, meaningless, abstraction. I hope to help all of us to find "I believe in the Holy Spirit" an expression of faith that results from personal experience and an expression filled with meaningful content.
