This program will serve as an introduction to a new mission program in which Trinity is involved in cooperation with Florida State University.

Dr. Sykes is director of Education for Special Needs (rehabilitative sciences) at the university. Through him people will be brought to this country from other countries of the world to receive special training (obtaining masters degrees) which will prepare them to return to their own people to set up pilot projects in rehabilitation.

Richard Ezenwukwa is receiving his tuition and support from Trinity this year. He will return in June to East Central Nigeria (formerly Biafra) to set up a program of help among people who have recently suffered the devastation of war.

WE WILL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE A COMMITMENT NEXT SUNDAY MORNING that will have a crucial effect on Trinity's future. That commitment will affect not only the program of Trinity for 1974 but will determine in large measure whether Trinity will continue to march forward as a great church or will begin to wither and die.

FOR SEVERAL YEARS THE BUDGET OF THIS CHURCH HAS REMANIED ABOUT THE SAME. In the meantime the economy of the world outside the church has spiraled upward — ever upward. (One man said, "I wouldn't mind inflation if the prices didn't keep going up." This has meant that instead of keeping pace with the obligations which the Gospel places upon us, we have had to curtail our program and thus diminish our witness.

RECENTLY YOUR ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD and your Council on Ministries has examined who we are as a church and what our purpose is. Then out of this came A SET OF EXCITING GOALS for Trinity. These goals are reflected in the PROGRAM AND BUDGET FOR 1974.

These goals, if achieved, will go a long way towards getting Trinity into forward gear. BUT THESE GOALS WILL NOT BE REACHED IF OUR GIVING REMAINS AT ITS PRESENT LEVEL.

I hope that all of us will use this next week as a time for prayer and as a time for looking at our giving levels over the past few years. And then NEXT SUNDAY LET'S COME TO CHURCH READY TO DO THE WILL OF GOD IN TERMS OF OUR PERSONAL COMMITMENT TO HIM AND HIS CHURCH.

Below you will find excerpts of a letter written last week by K. C. Sykes, Ph.D., Program Leader, Special Education at Florida State University to Mr. Chibututu, Administrative Secretary, Nigeria National Advisory Council for the Blind, Lagos, Nigeria:

The Special Education Program at Florida State University in cooperation with Trinity United Methodist Church, Tallahassee, and the FSU Foundation recently set up a fund entitled: Global Ministries: Special Education. The fund is to enable overseas teachers and administrators from the developing countries to train at FSU in the area of special education. This program offers undergraduate and graduate teacher preparation and leadership programs in Mental Retardation, Visual Disabilities and Interrelated Areas of Special Education (i.e., mild Mental Retardation, Learning Disabilities and Emotional Disturbance). I am enclosing details of these programs for your perusal.

Presently we have one graduate student, Mr. Richard Ezenwukwa, from East Central State, Nigeria, completing his Master's degree in Visual Disabilities and receiving support from the fund. We shall have available sufficient monies to award two more grants for the 1974-5 academic year.

The amount of the award is based on a reasonable estimate of the cost for attending FSU for those students living in a university residence and participating in a campus food plan. For graduate students this would be \$750.00 and for undergraduate students \$700.00 per term on an in-state fee basis. A recipient attending for one academic year (i.e., three terms: Fall, Winter and Spring) would therefore receive approximately \$2,250.00. The awards are to be made on a term basis and are contingent upon the candidate satisfying FSU admission requirements and on the maintenance of a satisfactory level of work. It is understood that students accepting these awards will, upon completion of their training, return to their own countries to initiate or upgrade programs of education and/or rehabilitation for the handicapped.
