WHERE DOES ALL THE MONEY GO — the money that we give in the special WORLD COMMUNION offering to be received TODAY, OCTOBER 7, 1973? (Special envelopes are being provided for you to use during the worship service — or you may mail a check for this purpose to the church office.)

1. UNITED METHODIST CHAPLAINS. Chaplains in the military service, serving in hospitals, working in prisons, are making their witness to Jesus Christ in special ways.
2. STUDENTS. Part of this money will be used to provide scholarships to American Indians, Blacks, and other young people from minority groups. The schools offering these scholarships require students who receive help to maintain a high grade average, have a recommendation from their local church, and be willing to work part-time at some campus job.
3. MORE STUDENTS. Part of this money will go to Christian young men and women from other countries who are studying in this country.

By the way, the Commission on Missions here at Trinity is developing a program in cooperation with the Department of Education for Special Needs at Florida State University for enabling students from other countries to come to Tallahassee for training in rehabilitative sciences. We are planning a special program on this for a Sunday night later this month.

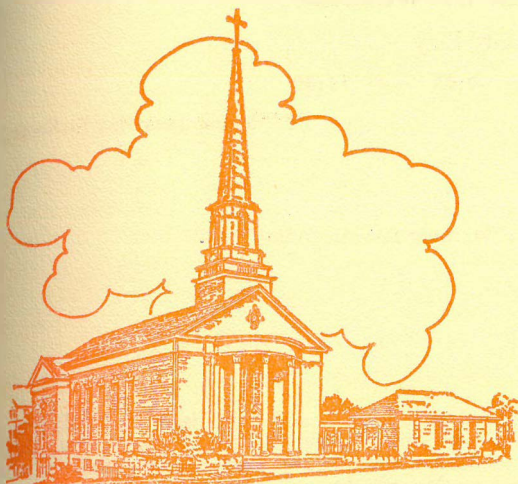

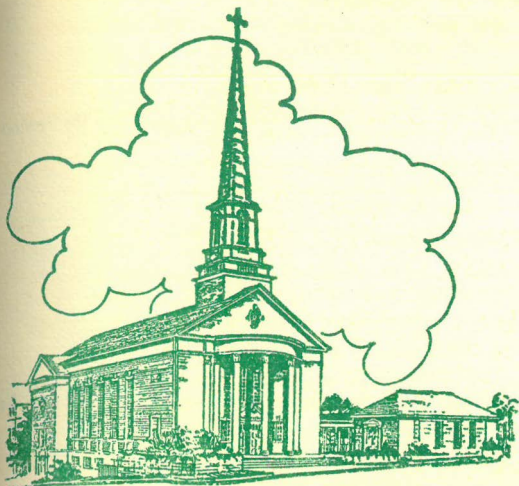

"TRUTH IN LENDING" is a legal requirement for the banks in Florida. "TRUTH IN REPORTING" is the ethical requirement for the Tidings of Trinity. WE HAVE BEEN REPORTING A SURPLUS in our financial statement. "SURPLUS" is not a good word here for two reasons:

(1) The surplus figure is the amount of money received OVER THE BUDGET THAT WAS ADOPTED FOR 1973. That budget is one which necessitated chopping out some people and programs that are vital to Trinity Church's ministry. For example we have been operating for a year and a half without a Director of Christian Education which has of course added to the load and cut down the effectiveness of the two ministers on our staff (Norman and Brown).

(2) The surplus figure is the amount of money received over the budget that was adopted for 1973. But EMERGENCIES, INFLATION, AND EX-IGENCIES OF PROGRAM have blown big holes in that budget.

I am using extra space in this week's Tidings to give you a report in some detail of some of these expenditures so that you will have a clear picture of what I am talking about here.

For example, I am sure that all of us recall that we had a breakdown in our air-conditioning equipment in July and August. This involved among other things a compressor which has been in operation since about 1947. That one "item" cost us over \$5,700. We have spent a total of \$7,200 on air-conditioning maintenance and repairs so far in 1973.

Some of the pipes in the older parts of our buildings have let us know that they require attention to the tune of \$500 in plumbing bills we have had to pay.

Electrical repairs have amounted to \$550.

Continuing the painting and improvements of our buildings which was begun last year, we have spent over \$3,000 painting classrooms, hallways, rest rooms, base boards, a new roof on the Edwards Street parsonage, repairs to the parking lot, and general building upkeep.

There has been an increase in the cost of utilities amounting to about \$300 per month.

Inflation also has been reflected in higher costs for all paper supplies, an increase in the cost of printing our bulletin, and janitorial supplies.

I am writing this Tidings with a feeling of great appreciation for the fact that you have been giving over and above the amount that we had expected for this year. This has made it possible for us to do the things we have had to do and yet pay all of our bills and meet all of our obligations on schedule.
