THE CHURCH LIVES FOR OTHERS — OR IT DOESN'T LIVE. Jesus said to the Church, "As the Father has sent me, so send I you." Henrik Kraemer said that the Church IS ministry. In other words we don't come into being as a church and then discuss how and where and when we will serve. WE ARE HERE TO MINISTER IN THE WORLD OR WE ARE NOT HERE AS A CHURCH.

There is a big difference between church work and the work of the Church. We can get so involved in doing church work (keeping the machinery operating — and of course that needs to be done) that we never become the Church doing its work of ministry in the world.

The early Church was a minority movement with a major mission — to win the world. It still is. William Temple said, "We are the early Christians." We are committed to their Christ who loves us as He loved them. We are followers of their Christ who calls us to mission as He called them.

In the membership statement of the Church of the Saviour, Washington, D. C., is the description of the Christian Church as a ship on which "there are no passengers; all are crew members."

The Church is the body of Christ bound together in Him so that while there is diversity of functions, and of gifts, and of abilities, there is a unity of commitment and purpose. As the body of Christ the Church receives its authority from Him and its power from Him. As the body of Christ, the Church must be in the world as He is in the world — to reconcile, to redeem, to serve.

For the Church to BE the Church each of us must be open to receive the gift of grace; and at the same time we must be open to the hurt of the world to which God calls us to give of ourselves in ministry. That takes CONSECRATION.





WHAT DO WE DO with those forms you filled out on the front page of last week's Tidings? If they have to do with the United Methodist Women, Methodist Men, or Methodist Youth, we turn them over to the appropriate person in each organization. The rest will be used by the Nominating Committee as we nominate persons for the various Boards, Councils, and Committees of Trinity for 1974.

OUR MOST RECENT ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD MEETING was one of the most exciting and responsive Board Meetings I ever have attended in my experience in the Church.

We shared together our understanding of **WHO WE ARE** as the Church. In the light of our thinking here we went on to develop our **PURPOSE**. Future meetings of the Council on Ministries and Task Groups, as well as the Administrative Board will continue to develop these understandings of who we are, and our Purpose and move on developing **GOALS** that will express ways of fulfilling our Purpose.

It was interesting to note that our understanding of **WHO WE ARE** as the Church was derived from the New Testament. Taking the many insights into our nature as suggested by members of the Board that night, the following statement expresses pretty much the way we see ourselves at this time: We are a **COMMUNITY OF BELIEVERS IN CHRIST, CHILDREN OF GOD** and therefore having a responsibility to each other within the **FELLOWSHIP**; the **BODY OF CHRIST** and therefore having a responsibility of being **SERVANTS** out there in the world.

WHO WE ARE is the basis for determining our Purpose. Taking the contributions shared by the members of the Board during our discussion, the following statement expresses pretty much **OUR PURPOSE** as we see it at this time:

As the Church we are here to provide opportunities for **WORSHIP** of **GOD** and **EDUCATION** in the nature and way of Christ, to create an environment in which we experience the **LOVE OF GOD** (as the grace that leads to salvation) and are able to express a **REAL CONCERN FOR ONE ANOTHER** within the fellowship. We are to involve ourselves in a **STEWARDSHIP** in which who we are and what we have are used according to God's purpose in a **SELF-GIVING CONCERN FOR OTHERS** no matter who or where they are.
