The final meeting of the Tallahassee District Conference was held November 21 with Trinity serving as the host and District Superintendent Reverend Antonio Fernandez presiding. Those gathered at the conference also witnessed the birth of the new North West Florida District and learned of the changes it will bring.

In Florida, the Methodist church has reduced the number of districts from 14 to 9. There will be approximately 85 member churches in the new North West District, as compared to the previous 61 member

Tallahassee District of which Trinity was a member. Within the district, there will be smaller cluster groups comprised of likesized churches, with similar program emphasis.

After concluding the business of the Tallahassee District in the sanctuary, the participants moved into Moor Hall, symbolizing the transition from the old to the new.
