




The church basically takes over the Meals on Wheels facility, thereby giving







Everyone experiences difficulties or crises at some point in his or her life, perhaps a serious illness or death of a loved one or problems with children or a spouse. In these and other situations, it's helpful to know that others have faced similar situations and to be able to get information or advice for dealing with the issue. McKenzie Library has a number of books written to help people face a variety of problems or challenges.

**A Spiritual Journey Through Breast Cancer: Strength for Today, Hope for Tomorrow** by Judi Asti. The author, a breast cancer survivor, tells about coping with her diagnosis and extensive

treatments and shares the ways in which her faith was strengthened through this difficult experience.

**When Marriage Breaks Up: A Guide for Christians** by Pauline Druiff. This book, written by the divorced spouse of an Anglican minister, deals with the emotional, spiritual, and practical aspects of the break up of a marriage and offers hope for future happiness.

**When Bad Things Happen to Good People** by Harold Kushner. This classic book, written by a Jewish rabbi facing the fatal illness of his child, has relevance for people of all faiths who face suffering in their lives or the lives of others.

**Help, Lord! I'm Having a Senior Moment:**

**Notes to God on Growing Older** by Karen O'Connor. Author Karen O'Connor draws on the experiences of many people and writes with wisdom, compassion and humor about the frustrations, embarrassments, and difficulties of growing older.

**Aging Parents & You: A Complete Handbook to Help You Help Your Elders Maintain a Healthy, Productive and Independent Life** by Eugenia Anderson-Ellis and Marsha Dryan. A bit dated, but still has practical advice for adult children on helping their aging parents with issues related to health, finance, living arrangements, and activities.

Methodist Church.






