the Moor Hall Renovation PROJECT



For more than 40 years, Moor Hall has been an integral part of the life and outreach of Trinity. Despite that, very little has been done to update the facility since it was first built. In order to serve both its current and future uses, we plan to start a long overdue renovation of Moor Hall in June, as soon as Vacation Bible School is over. An architectural rendering of the planned renovation – which is estimated to cost \$300,000 – is located on an easel in the narthex on Sunday mornings, and in the Welcome Center through the rest of the week.

New features for renovated Moor Hall

- Cover entire floor with removable, washable carpet squares
- Install curtains to dampen outside noise and to darken the room in order to better see video shown on the screens
- Remove faulty sliding glass doors and replace with insulated windows and French doors, and relocate the memorial stained glass cross to face the prayer garden
- Buffer Moor Hall from kitchen noise
- Install new up-to-date audio-video system
- Add new energy efficient, flexible lighting
- Enlarge the stage and add storage




Now Keith's own son, Bradley, is about two and a half. The last time we were in their home, Bradley asked the blessing.

We each need to "praise" Him in the manner and style that fits our demeanor.


Now lest you think I'm saying my grandson is perfect - he is not. For

Victims of our own success?





A small snack will be provided.


Proceeds from your donations will be used for youth mission trips with 10% going to the Moor Hall Renovation Project.

If you see anything that needs fixing, please let one of the trustees or a staff member know. Often times, the only way the trustees learn of something not working is by hearing it from a member of the congregation.


Attention all graduates


A Note from Kelly ...

Rising 6th Grade BBQ






Trinity Treks for May

The Trinity youth had several representatives helping entertain. Their help was welcomed and appreciated.





May's "Change" goes to America's Second Harvest


