Trinity welcomes Reverends Curry and Fotsch and families

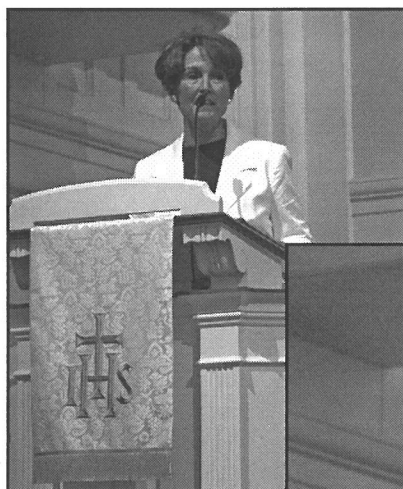
Alleluia

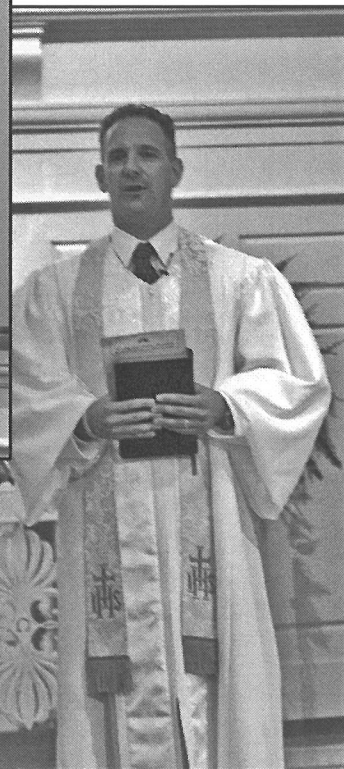
So, when Reverend Curry began to speak of how, through our love and respect for one another, we could better receive and share God's love, a responsive chord was struck.

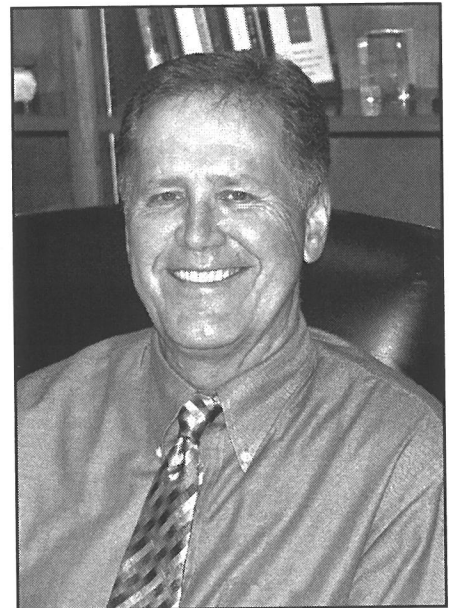
Do you remember the theme from the old television show "Cheers?"

Sometimes you want to go where

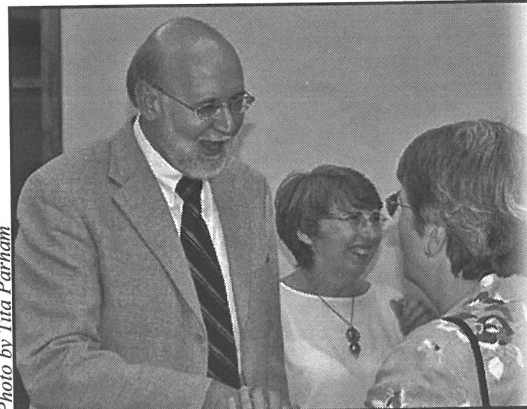

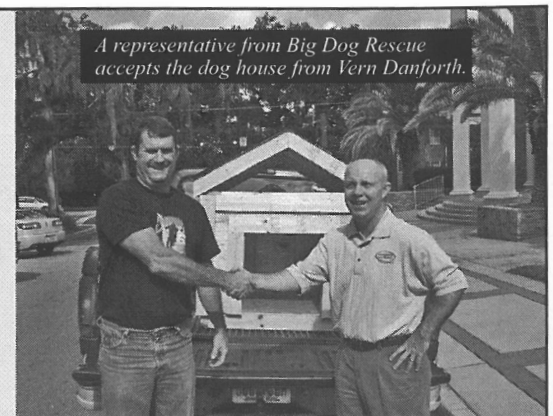

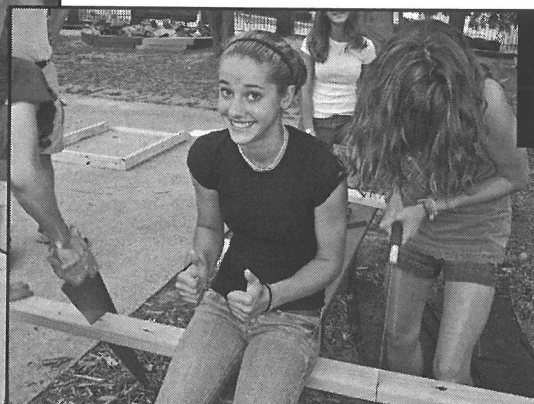
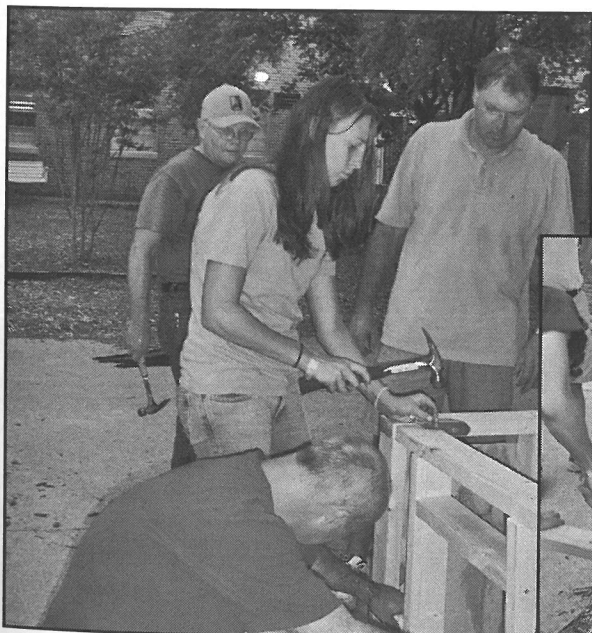

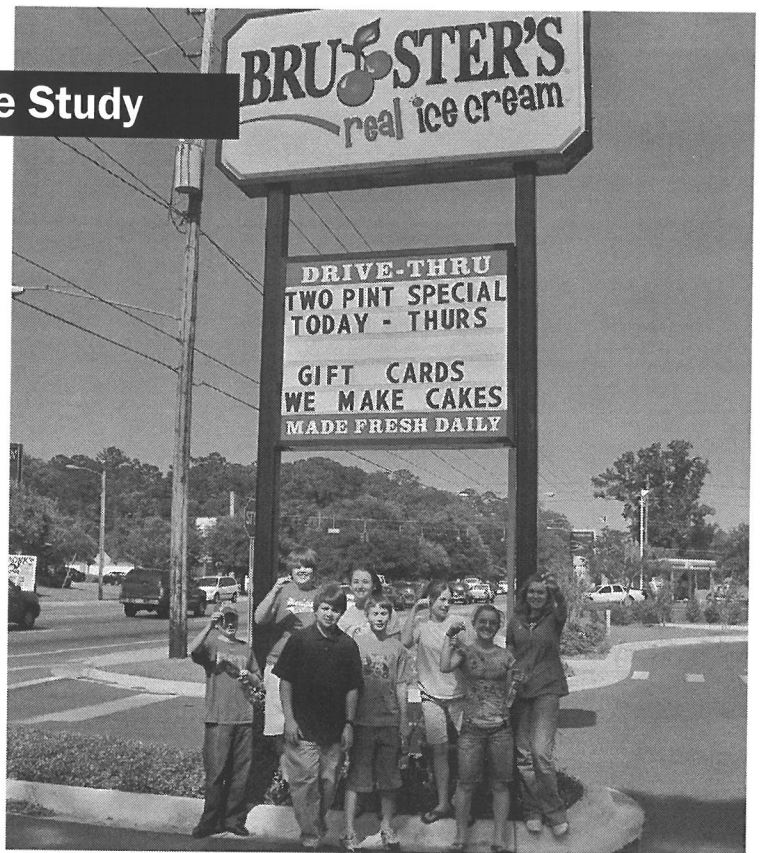

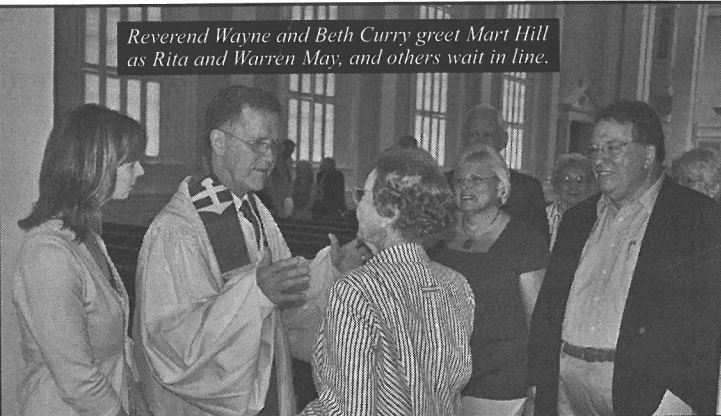

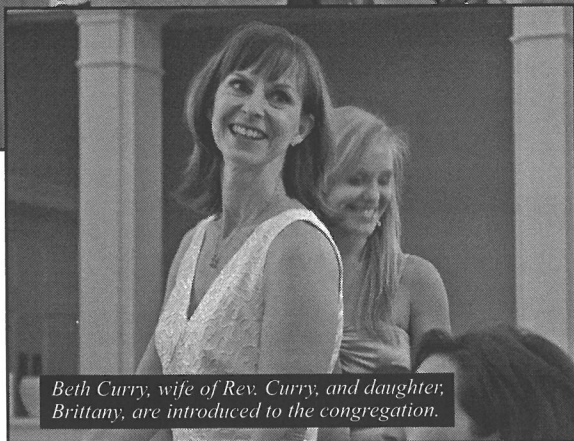

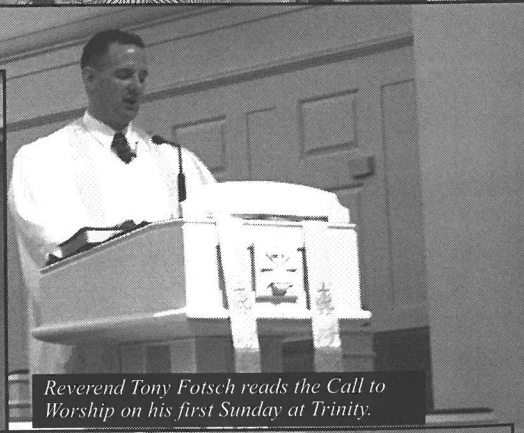

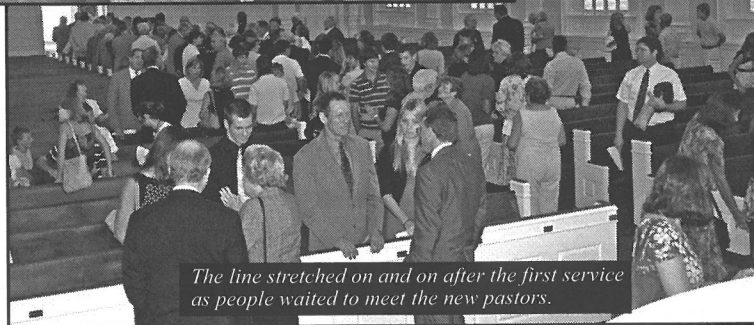

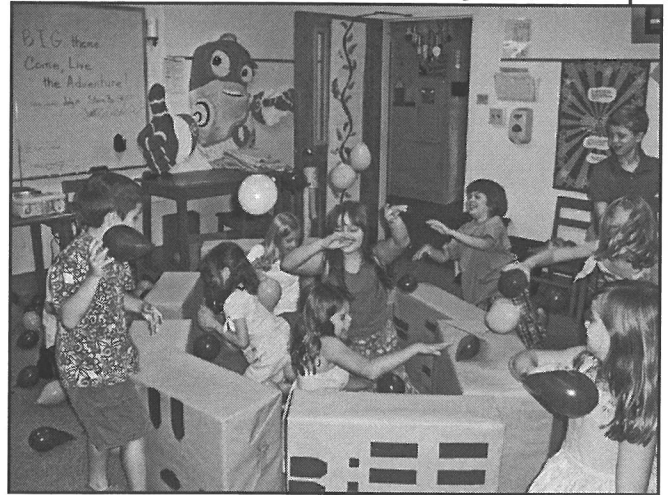

Green happenings at the Preschool!

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle...the preschool has made a few changes in an effort to be more mindful of our natural resources! Below is a short list of the things we are doing to try to make a difference!

- 1) To reduce the amount of paper we send home, we now send e-newsletters and only print receipts to those families that specifically request them.

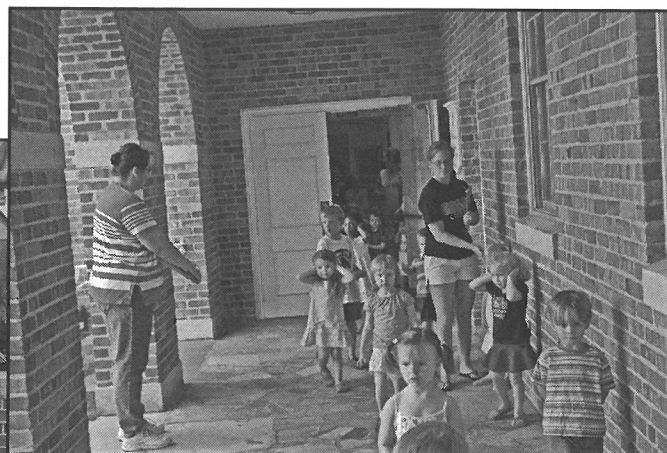

These two items saved the school 2½ reams of paper over the last year. (There are over 400 preschool and day care centers in Leon County; imagine if we all saved 2½ reams each year!)

- 2) The children are recycling paper products in each classroom - the children participate in bi-weekly recycling parties where they go to the recycle bin and dump each classroom's paper



"Boy, that horn is loud!" Fire drills are not the most popular thing for preschoolers, but the drills are necessary to keep everyone safe.

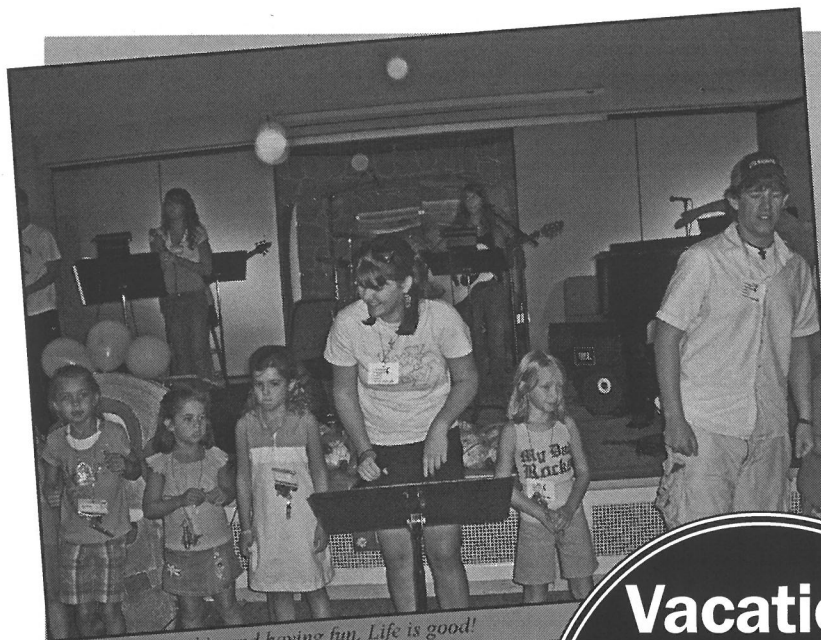
- 3) Craft projects very often include the use of recycled products - we can do many things with a paper towel roll and a yogurt container!

- 4) While playing outside, the children like to get a drink from the water fountain and then spit out

- 5) We have switched over to a green product (H2Orange) for most of our cleaning; (we still use Clorox to disinfect the toys and floor).
- 6) We use rechargeable batteries whenever possible.

- 7) During the last 8 months, we have installed 5 new sensor faucets in the classrooms; this has helped stop the constant flow of water when a child "forgets" to turn the water off!

- 8) Because it is so important that children learn the fine motor skills necessary for writing and drawing, we always have markers and paper available for them to draw on; this paper is very often scrap paper, old church stationery, or packing materials from an item purchased by the school. There are times when new construction paper is needed, but often all they need is some old scrap paper!
