### **Beautiful ritual**


Sunday, January 6 presents a unique opportunity for Trinity members. Since United Methodists are generally baptized as infants, and since we believe that baptism should occur only once, the beauty of the baptismal ceremony is usually not fully experienced by the baptized.

### **Renewal of vows**

As an infant, one is not fully aware of the grace that has been bestowed through baptism nor is one cognizant of the responsibilities attendant to the act. As an adult, however, the power, wonder, and fullness of the ritual are experienced.

This is one of those "named" Sundays that has become a tradition at Trinity. As Reverend Willis says, "if we do something more than once, it is a tradition."


### Looking Back and Looking Forward


Brett has been married to his wife Lisa for 15 years and they have 3 children: Kerry, Alexandria, and Mark.

enriched as they visited and provided assistance on behalf of Trinity.


All HEO volunteers are invited to attend the luncheon meeting where they will be recognized for their service to others.




