Finding a new way up the hill

Could this finally be the answer to the riddle of how best to deliver people from the lower parking lots to the front door of the sanctuary? This same question has been asked before in recent history and the puzzle has gone without solution.

Until now. In the pictures arrayed throughout this page is the vehicle, purchased by the trustees, which may finally solve this Rubik's cube of travel — a 6-passenger, street-legal, American-built electric car.

There will be several places around the church property to wait for the GEM car: the library parking lot (look for a flag or other

prominent marker in the parking lot that will point the way to the pick-

up place); the bench by the half-circle drive-in, by the exterior courtyard, and in front of the church. After church, just wait out in front of the church for the car to take you right back to your car. The waiting time for the next car should be brief since the GEM car is able to transport 5 riders (and the driver) at a time, and travels safely at 25 mph. Plus, you just step in to get on board. You don't need to climb over anything or anyone.

This wonderful solution was made possible by a gift from Gwen V. Roberts and family, whose planned giving and foresight will also fund the new playground later this month.

Rain or shine, just hop aboard the Trinity express and you will be delivered to the front door of the church, or your car! This is going to work! Come on back to church and try it out.

It's been a busy summer here at Trinity United Methodist Church! Vacation Bible

School, Youth mission trips, Weddings, Baptisms, and lots of renovations of our physical plant. Through the generous gift of the late Gwen V. Roberts we have built a new playground for our children and have started a new GEM car parking lot ministry—a six-passenger electric vehicle that transports folks from the library parking lot 'up the hill' to the sanctuary on Sunday mornings (see picture on front). We have put a fresh coat of paint on Moor

Hall and many other places throughout the facilities. The beautifully renovated 'Bride's Room' (see picture in this newsletter) is bedecked with wedding pictures of members of our church who have been married 50 years or more as an inspiration to new brides. We'll be doing the same to the 'Groom's Room'. The Youth Rooms downstairs have been completely updated with new sound and light equipment, carpet, storage cabinets, and paint. Soon we will be replacing all the windows (144 of them!) in the education building. There is new and improved signage throughout the buildings. On the third floor a beautiful Trinity United Methodist Church History and Archive Room is being established to preserve and

celebrate the rich 185 year history of our great church.

We hope to have everything completed by Sunday, September 20th, when we will celebrate our 185th Anniversary! You'll be hearing more about this special Sunday but be sure and put it on your calendars now. There will be food, fellowship and tours (when was the last time you took a tour of our facilities? Ever?) . Our organist, Rob Hlebinsky and our talented member and trumpeter,

Randall Haynes, will give a concert that afternoon in the sanctuary. All of that will wet your appetite for the next Sunday, September 27th, when we will celebrate the 10 year anniversary of the installation of our wonderful Casavant Organ. Famed organist David Higgs from Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, will present a recital at 4:00PM. Don't miss it!

Obviously this is just touching the service of what is happening every day at Trinity! I'm glad YOU are a part of this faith community and I am blessed to be one of your pastors!











Making Music, Meeting God

Late August and early September marks the beginning of a new season of music-making and God-meeting here at Trinity! Soon, we will welcome back from summer break, many musicians who have been part of our choral and instrumental

groups in years past. This article is a reminder and "welcome back" to these "veterans" of all ages, but also an invitation for others to join us. And now is a great time to join, since most groups are starting anew after the summer break.

There are currently 12 music groups at the church, with participants ranging in age from 2 years old all the way up to their early 80's. We offer a wide range of music-making and God-meeting opportunities at Trinity, including 3 children's choirs, children's handbells (fall semester each year), two adult handbell groups, seniors handchimes, two praise bands, Trinity Flutes, Youth Choir and Chancel Choir. Additional instrumentalists are involved in our worship services on an as-needed basis. So, which group would you like to join? Except for the praise bands and Trinity Ringers, the easiest way to join is come to one of our rehearsals, and we will sign you up!

Chancel Choir

Our Chancel Choir (pictured below) is the flagship choir of the church, singing about 45 Sundays each year. We sing at numerous special services each year such as Ash Wednesday and Christmas Eve.



The Chancel Choir is comprised of many talented singers, many of whom have classically trained voices.

Once or twice each year we present special music, like a concert or Sunday morning cantata. The group enjoys occasional social activities as well; a small family within the large "family" of the church. We resume rehearsals on Wednesday, August 19, 7:30-8:45 p.m.

This group is about half college students and half young adults. They meet on Sundays, 6:30-7:30 p.m. starting September 13. You must be able to read music to join.

Men's Ensemble




A Note from Kelly ...



Rock the Universe












