


# Finding and (hopefully) using Trinity's Social Media

# Shelter Board Votes To Merge With Kearney Center

In a unanimous vote, representatives from The Shelter and The Kearney Center announced in February their intention to merge the two organizations in order to strengthen future operations. Within 60 days, The Shelter will complete the transition and operate under CESC Inc. (Comprehensive Emergency Services Center), the legal entity of The Kearney Center, with a continued focus on serving the homeless and those in need of the Big Bend area. The announcement comes nearly one year after both organizations started operating out of the new, stateof-the-art Kearney Comprehensive **Emergency Services Center.** 

Since the physical move to the Kearney Center in May 2015, The Shelter has worked alongside more than 40 state, federal and local governmental agencies, non-profit and faith based organizations to provide comprehensive services for the homeless in the Big Bend area.

The merger will allow for increased efficiencies, services, resources and opportunities to serve the individuals and families in need in the region.

"Our team has been working in lockstep with the Kearney Center for nearly a year," said Jacob Reiter, Executive Director of The Shelter. "Our two teams are already operating as one when it comes to dedication and passion for serving those in need in our community. This merger allows us to expand and improve the services we deliver, and this is something easy to get behind."

The staff of The Shelter will be retained, and current services will be continued and enhanced over time. The current Board of The Kearney Center will expand to include members from the current Shelter Board of Directors.

"For nearly 30 years, the dedicated staff, volunteers and donors of The

> Shelter have been fighting homelessness and have been a guiding light for those in need," said Rick

Kearney, Founder and Chairman of Board for The Kearney Center. "This merger combines their passion with expanded resources to ensure we can continue to do so for the next 30 years and beyond."

The mission of the Kearney Center is to reduce homelessness, increase employment and provide long-term housing placements while providing safe emergency housing that promotes dignity and respect for individuals in our community who are experiencing homelessness, unemployment, disabilities and hunger.

### Welcome Reverend Dr. Wayne D. Wiatt

The Reverend Dr. Wayne D. Wiatt grew up in rural north Florida where he was on the "cradle roll" at Cherry Lake UMC and was confirmed at First United Methodist Church of Madison, Florida, under Dr. Tom Kelsey. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Sacred Music, and a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry from Emory University where his thesis, "Children in Worship: Participation Through Creative Dramatics," studied the many ways children can be included in leadership in a worship setting. During college, he was employed as a summer youth intern at Trinity UMC, Tallahassee and answered his call to ministry under the mentoring of Rev. Phil Roughton, Rev John Green, and Dr. Gene Zimmerman. During seminary, he served as youth director at Glenn Memorial United Methodist Church on the Emory campus and worked closely with Dr. Carlton R. Young, editor of the United Methodist Hymnal.

After graduating from Emory, Wayne served under Dr. Thomas E. Farmer, Jr. as associate pastor at First United Methodist Church in Jacksonville from '84-'88 and was appointed as senior pastor of Palm Coast United Methodist Church in 1988. While at Palm Coast, he received the Harry Denman award for Evangelism. He was appointed to Southside United Methodist Church, Jacksonville, in 1996 until he was

appointed as Superintendent of the East Central District in June of 2006 where he served for seven years.

Wayne is completing his third year of service on the Extended Cabinet of the Florida Conference as the Director of Clergy Excellence. He has the responsibility of care and oversight for those seeking Candidacy, Licensing, and Ordination in the United Methodist Church. The Office of Clergy Excellence also is the steward of Lifelong Learning through a variety of Continuing Education Opportunities including Leadership, Spiritual Formation, Preaching, and Educational Travel Opportunities for Licensed and Ordained Clergy.

His leadership and involvement beyond the local church includes membership in Rotary International for 18 years, Habitat for Humanity, past president of United Way of Flagler County, Healing Racial Division Project of Jacksonville, graduate of Leadership Jacksonville and a past president of United Community Outreach Ministries, Jacksonville. He has served on the Board of Trustees for Bethune Cookman University, The Florida United Methodist Children's Home, Central Florida Wesley Foundation, Stetson University Wesley Foundation, and FREE Prison Ministry. He currently serves on

the Board of Zoe Ministries, a youth empowerment ministry for orphans in Regional Africa, the Alumni Board for Candler School of Theology, Emory University, and the United Methodist Publishing House Board of Directors, Nashville Tennessee. He has served as a Delegate to the Southeastern Jurisdictional and General Conferences of the United Methodist Church.

Wayne is married to Ramona Folds, formerly of Titusville, Florida and they have two grown children.
