Dear Dr Anderson:-

Just received my copy of the servicemen's bulletin and appreciate it very much. I have been able to keep track of several of the Tallahassee boys in the shuffle — some of them have been here & left for other parts and some with whom I was also in school at LivELY are still in Miami Beach — "Hotel Basics". From what I hear of that, Camp Murphy looks like heaven.

It hasn't been so bad here for me. The work has been very exacting and pretty hard to keep up with, but intensely interesting. It would be a great morale builder if anyone in doubt about the outcome of this war could see what we've got here and could realize what it will do.

Personally it's been very nice to be able to get down to Lauderdale and see my folks occasionally. Grueniew came down for a little visit but has been in pretty bad shape with neuralgia, and, I think, worry about me. This equipment has a pretty sinister reputation in these parts and that may be it. At any rate, she is in Lauderdale with my folks now and seems to be happy there.

As usual I'm on the move again — expect to leave here this week sometime. Destination unknown — probably some place in the south for additional training in Radar. This is of course the main school but from now on it will be field training and, in due course of time, attachment to some outfit and I'll get a good long trip.

Will try to keep you posted from time to time what goes on.
