I hope that you and your family enjoyed a beautiful Christmas there, and that our new year of 1944 will be both happy and optimistic for all.

We arrived at our first port (of my present trip) on Christmas evening. Upon anchoring in the harbour, we had a most impressive Christmas program on the fantail of our ship. Though our tree was both small and artificial, it was beautiful. The Red Cross had even furnished us with gifts before we left the states, to be used for this occasion.
